

ELC Family of International Schools is committed to providing an intellectually stimulating and challenging learning environment, which encourages mental growth and free communication of ideas and skills. As part of this commitment, efforts have been made to ensure that our space meets the needs of our children, including the standard of air quality.

On a daily basis (7.30am and 11.30am) the office measures the air quality using a monitoring system for the ELC Outdoors. The monitor is able to detect levels of Particulate Matter smaller than 2.5 microns (PM 2.5) - the monitoring standard for air quality. On days when the air is unhealthy, the levels continue to be monitored throughout the day.

We have an Air Quality plan in place that uses the code system based on the Air Quality Index scale as defined by the US-EPA 2016 standard. This serves to alert the ELC staff to that particular day's air quality so we know when and how to modify our outdoor activities and outdoor events. A procedure is followed when the school community (staff and parents) are notified, should the air quality be such that the PE programme, outside playtimes, specialist classes, and After School activities (ASA's) and community events are affected.
